New York State has long had standards for determining the physical and mental fitness of persons caring for children in the context of foster care or an adoption. This rule simplifies, standardizes and modernizes these requirements by removing provisions, such as annual requirements for tuberculosis testing and chest x-rays, even when person have no symptoms that would otherwise medically indicate that such test are appropriate or eiligble for insurance coverage.
