This	s report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns:
	A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
	The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
	The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
	The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

The subject child was a medically fragile 7-year-old child. There was an open family services case at the time of the fatality to provide the family with assistance in obtaining the in-home support and care services for the child. On 10/25/15, the mother checked on the subject child and he was non-responsive. She contacted 911 while her paramour attempted cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR). Emergency Medical Services and local law enforcement officers responded to the home, and the child was transported to Adirondack Medical Center where he was pronounced dead at 8:00 AM. No autopsy was performed because the coroner and pediatrician agreed that the child's medical fragility had already severely diminished life expectancy, and that his demise was anticipated to have happened far earlier than it did.

Executive Summary

On 10/25/15, the subject child was discovered by the mother to be unresponsive. After resuscitation efforts by the mother's paramour, law enforcement and emergency medical services, the child was transported to Adirondack Medical Center. The ER doctor indicated cause of death was respiratory arrest. The subject child's persistent fragile medical health dated back to 5/11/09. The subject child suffered from Microcephaly, Apnea/Bradypnea, and other medical conditions, which were diagnosed to severely diminish his life expectancy.

At the time of the subject child's death, FCDSS had an open services case, to monitor the mother's compliance with family court orders of supervision and protection. The subject child and his 3 and 4-year old siblings had previously been removed and placed in foster care on 2/26/13. The children were placed following an incident between the parents, where the father pointed and discharged a loaded firearm toward the mother in the presence of the children. The children were placed in foster care. The subject child was placed at St. Margaret's Center, due to his medical fragility. The subject child received medical care, occupational, physical and speech therapy while in placement.

The mother gave birth to another child in November 2013. The child remained in the mother's care contingent on her compliance with extended court orders of supervision and protection. The mother had engaged in court ordered services, and the siblings had been returned to the mother on a trial discharge on 10/25/13 with a final discharge on 5/23/14. The subject child remained in foster care until 5/26/15, due to his continued needs for 24-hour medical care and supervision. The court orders expired on 12/5/15 based on the mother's continued cooperation and participation with services.

The father was arrested and charged with felony and misdemeanor counts of assault in February 2013, which resulted in the father's incarceration and the children's removal. The father remained incarcerated at the time of the subject child's death. The father had not complied with court orders while incarcerated. The father failed to petition the court for visits with his children and failed to engage in services.

FCDSS provided the mother with supportive services and assisted with transportation for visits with the subject child and siblings in placement. FCDSS maintained regular contact with the mother, father, foster parents, and with the subject child and siblings in their respective placements. The mother and her paramour regularly visited with the

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subject child at the health care facility, and actively participated in planning for the subject child's return home, which occurred on 5/26/15. FCDSS maintained regular contact with the mother, her paramour and all children in the home of the paramour. FCDSS continued to provide the family with supportive services before and after the subject child's death.

LDSS Response

On 10/25/15, FCDSS was notified by local law enforcement that the mother had found the subject child to be unresponsive. He was transported to Adirondack Medical Center and the attending physician pronounced time of death at 8:00 AM. FCDSS was also informed of discussions between hospital staff, the coroner and the subject child's pediatrician about the child's medically fragile condition directly contributing to the child's early demise. The coroner determined no autopsy was necessary. No concerns were identified during conversations regarding the mother's care of the subject child. FCDSS met with the family to offer assistance with any funeral or other arrangements, and provide support. The surviving siblings were assessed and no concerns were identified. The surviving siblings remained in the care of the mother and paramour. FCDSS continued to provide day care assistance to the family while the mother and paramour attended to other matters. Local law enforcement and FCDSS notified the father in prison of the subject child's death and to offer counseling and support.

The cause of death recorded on the death certificate was respiratory arrest as a result of the medical condition of the subject child. There was no reasonable cause to suspect that child abuse/maltreatment by either the mother or paramour

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around the subject child's death. Therefore, no report was made to the SCR. FCDSS continued to provide preventive services to the family following the child's death to monitor the mother's compliance with court orders and supervision.

Report Summary:

On 1/17/13, an SCR report alleged IFCS against the parents regarding the subject child and siblings. It was reported that garbage and numerous dogs were in the home. One of the dogs was vicious, and there was a strong unexplained odor. The case was appropriately screened and assigned to the FAR track. Interviews, home visits, review of medical records, and completion of the FLAG revealed that the parents provided appropriate care to the children, and the home met minimal standards for cleanliness. On 2/26/13, a new SCR report alleged IG due to a domestic incident between the parents involving a shotgun being fired in the presence of the children, and the case was no longer eligible for FAR.

OCFS Review Results:

Although FCDSS interviewed the mother, reviewed medical records and conducted home visits, caseworkers only observed part of the home and did not contact collateral sources to further explore what caused the strong odor in the home. Caseworkers did not gather sufficient information to assess safety and risk of future abuse/maltreatment. On 2/26/13, the case was no longer eligible for FAR, and was investigated from this point as a case of child abuse/maltreatment after a domestic incident occurred between the parents in the presence of the children.

Overall Completeness and Adequacy of Investigation

Summary:

Sufficient information was not gathered to assess safety at the time of the 7-day assessment. Collateral contacts were not made to explore what caused the strong odor in the home.

Report Summary:

On 2/26/13, an SCR report alleged that the birth parents failed to provide adequate shelter to the deceased child, and the then 5-month- and 2- year old siblings, due to the number of dogs residing in the home with the family, creating deplorable conditions. It was also alleged that the birth parents' involvement in a domestic incident in which a firearm was discharged in the home, in the presence of the children, placed the children in imminent danger.

Determination: Indicated **Date of Determination:** 04/30/2013

Basis for Determination:

The allegations were substantiated based on the father's admission to pointing the loaded firearm at the mother in the home and in the presence of the children, and to discharging the firearm in the children's presence. The allegations of IFCS were also substantiated based on multiple rooms being observed to contain dog feces and floors stained and soaked with urine. The case was closed on 4/30/13.

OCFS Review Results:

While FCDSS interviewed the mother, and obtained records from collateral sources such as law enforcement and dog control officer, there were no efforts made to interview the father or the aforementioned collateral contacts. As a result, sufficient information was not gathered to assess safety (at 24 hours, 7 days or at time of determination), risk of future abuse/maltreatment, and to make a determination, nor was there sufficient information gathered to assess the family's service needs.

Issue:

Overall Completeness and Adequacy of Investigation

Summary:

Sufficient information was not gathered to support decisions of safety, risk, determination, service needs, or removal of children. Collateral contacts were not made to resolve the conflicting accounts of events between the parents, as well as to support decisions that inform safety and risk of future abuse/maltreatment.

FCDSS must develop and implement a corrective action plan that addresses gathering sufficient information to support decisions of safety, risk, determination, service needs or removal of children, including contacting all significant collaterals.

The father, who was one of the subjects on the report, was not interviewed.

Report Summary:

On 2/28/13, an SCR report alleged IG against the mother's paramour regarding his then 17-year-old child. The child was forced to walk to medical appointments and ordered by the father to move out of the home by 3/1/13 with no alternate plan. The case was appropriately screened and assigned to the FAR track. Interviews, home visits, and completion of the FLAG revealed that the father had sought medical treatment for the child. The father had concerns about the child's substance use and had explored alternate options for the child's care by contacting family members, and explored a PINS petition. On 3/8/13, the family was referred for preventive services; the FAR case was closed on 3/6/13.

OCFS Review Results:

FCDSS interviewed the father, child, conducted home visits, and completed the FLAG. The current living arrangements in the father's home were determined to be suitable. The father had appropriately sought and coordinated medical care for the child, and appropriately explored alternative care arrangements with other family members and pursuit of legal activity, in an effort to ensure adequate care and supervision of the child. FCDSS appropriately opened a family services case to assist with continued case management and support.

Report Summary:

On 3/1/13, an SCR report alleged that the foster mother of the then 5-month and 2-year old siblings failed to provide adequate guardianship due to an incident in which the 2-year-old sibling was bitten by a dog while in the foster home, and that the foster parent failed to seek appropriate medical care for the child following the incident.

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Determination: Indicated **Date of Determination:** 04/03/2013

Basis for Determination:

The allegations were substantiated based on the foster mother's admission to withhold from FCDSS information about the dog biting the child and her decision to provide only basic first aid to the child. FCDSS reviewed police records from three prior incidents in which the dog had bit other children, and one in which the dog was unattended in the community, observed to be ill, and taken by law enforcement for medical examination because there were no caretakers present. The case was closed on 4/3/13.

OCFS Review Results:

FCDSS interviewed the foster mother, moved the children to a new foster home, and obtained records from law enforcement. However, there were no efforts to interview law enforcement about the prior dog bite incidents, required precautions to be taken thereafter, or to interview the child's medical provider regarding the decision not to seek further medical care after the incident. The foster parent's friend and co-owner of the dog was also present but not interviewed. As a result, sufficient information was not gathered to assess safety (at 24 hours, 7 days or at time of determination), risk of future abuse/maltreatment, or to make a determination, or to assess the family's service needs.

Issue:

Overall Completeness and Adequacy of Investigation

Summary:

Caseworkers did not conduct an adequate investigation, as sufficient information was not gathered to support assessments of safety and risk, determination and service needs. Collateral contacts were not made to gather key information regarding prior dog bite incidents, any required precautions, and regarding the adequacy of medical care for the child after the incident.

Report Summary:

On 11/13/13, an SCR report alleged that the birth parents failed to provide adequate guardianship of the then 4-day-old infant sibling based on the parent's prior maltreatment of the deceased child and then 1-year and 3-year old siblings, which had resulted in the prior removal of the children into foster care.

Determination: Indicated **Date of Determination:** 02/05/2014

Basis for Determination:

The allegations were substantiated and the infant child was determined to have been derivatively neglected based on the parents' prior neglect findings for the deceased child and two siblings. The prior neglect of the children had resulted in their foster care placement and family court orders of supervision and protection.

OCFS Review Results:

While FCDSS interviewed the birth parents, public health nurse, and temporary assistance worker, there were no

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documented assessments of the safety, risk and service needs related to the subject child, or of overall assessments of future risk/maltreatment for the siblings or of family service needs. Caseworkers gathered sufficient information to assess risk and family service needs in a concurrent services case, but did not sufficiently document the information in this investigation record. There was no credible evidence to support the child was derivatively neglected as he was receiving adequate care in the home.

Summary:

Based on concurrent open foster care services case with the family, caseworkers gathered, but did not sufficiently document in the investigation record, information to assess safety of the deceased child (who resided in a health care facility), of risk of future abuse/maltreatment to all children in the home, and of family service needs.

Preventive Services History

FCDSS opened a preventive services case on 7/14/09 for the parents and SC. Limited financial resources impeded the family's ability to attend to the child's medical needs. FCDSS provided referrals for supportive services, assisted with utility costs, and with transportation. The case was closed on 2/4/10; the family was stable and there were no safety or risk concerns.

FCDSS opened a preventive services case on 7/29/10 for the family to assist in meeting SC's medical needs. FCDSS assisted the family with transportation for the child's medical treatment. The case was closed on 9/10/10.

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FCDSS opened a preventive services case on 7/29/11 for the SM's paramour and his then 15-year and 16-year old children due to the children's substance abuse. FCDSS provided referrals for substance abuse treatment, case management and respite services. The case was closed on 7/5/12; the children had completed services, and there were no further service needs.

FCDSS opened a preventive services case on 3/8/13 for the SM's paramour and his then 17-year-old child due to the child's substance abuse and lack of attendance at school. FCDSS provided referrals for substance abuse treatment, and case management to address attendance in school. The case was closed on 9/25/14; the child had attained eighteen years of age on 10/25/13, and there were no further concerns regarding the child's substance use.

Foster Care Placement History

On 2/26/13, FCDSS removed the SC and siblings from the parents after an incident in which the father fired a loaded gun at the mother in the presence of the children. There were also concerns about the home's deplorable and unsafe condition. The siblings were placed in a certified non-relative foster home. The SC was admitted to a health care facility due to his condition, which required a higher level of care and supervision not available in a foster home.

In November 2013, the mother gave birth to a sibling, and this infant remained in the mother's care pursuant to court orders of supervision and protection pending her completion of court ordered services. The mother engaged in services, and the siblings were returned on a trial discharge on 10/25/13, with a final discharge from foster care on 5/23/14. The father was incarcerated for assault, and sentenced to prison until 2016. The father was not compliant with court orders, nor did he petition for visits with the children or engage in any services.

The SC remained at the health care facility for intensive 24-hour medical care and supervision. The mother and her paramour were actively involved in planning for the discharge of the SC, and the SC was returned to the mother's care on 5/26/15. FCDSS preventive services remained open with the family at the time of the fatality.
