This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

On 5/10/18, the SC was released from the hospital following a cardiac catheterization procedure. She was in stable condition at the time of discharge. On 5/11/18, the SC was playing with her sibling when she stopped breathing and turned blue. The BM began CPR and called 911. EMS responded and transported the SC to Lincoln Hospital where the SC was pronounced dead at 2:41 AM. The report named the parents as subjects because the SC was stable when she was released from the hospital and she was in the parents' care at the time of the incident.

Executive Summary

The SCR registered a report regarding the death of a two-year-old female that occurred on 5/11/18. The allegations of the report were DOA/Fatality and IG of the SC by the parents. The report named the parents as subjects because the SC was stable when she was released from the hospital and she was in the care of the parents at the time of the incident.

Following the receipt of the report, ACS' Bronx Field Office Specialist contacted Lincoln Hospital (LH) and obtained information regarding the incident. ACS learned the SC was born prematurely, at 26 weeks of gestation and was diagnosed with pulmonary hypertension (PH) and heart disease. On 5/10/18, at 8:00 AM, at Columbia Presbyterian hospital she had a major surgery; she was discharged at 3:00 PM; however, she was not sent home until approximately 5:30 PM due to observation. According to the Dr., the BM reported that the SC was well until 12:00 PM on 5/11/18, when she was given her medication and milk; she stopped breathing and appeared blue in color. The SM called 911 and an ambulance transported the SC to LH where the SC was pronounced dead at 2:41 AM. There was a three-year-old SS in the home at the time of the incident. The SS was in the care of the MGM while the parents were at the hospital. On 5/14/18, ACS assessed the SS and she was deemed to be safe and remained in the parents' care.

On 5/11/18, ACS learned from LE, EMS and the ME that the SC was found with no signs of maltreatment or abuse. According to LE, they found no criminality; it appeared the SC's death was due to medical complications. The parents confirmed the reported information.

On 5/11/18, ACS learned from the attending physician (AP) at LH that the SC arrived at the hospital via EMS at 12:59 AM, unresponsive. The AP reported the SC could not be resuscitated because of her heart condition.

On 5/14/18, ACS received information from the SC's cardiologist at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital (CPH) who confirmed the SC's diagnosis and explained the procedure that was recently performed. The Dr added that the SC's death was not caused by any "wrong doing" by the parents or the doctors as the SC was a "sick child."

On the same date, ACS learned from the surgeon who performed the procedure on the SC that the SC's pulmonary hypertension was "very severe." Post-surgery, the SC was prescribed oxygen and the visiting nurse agreed to assist. The surgeon stated there were no reported issues on the day of the procedure and no concerns for the SC's safety; both parents took good care of the SC. The SC was observed to be free of marks or bruises and was always clean and appropriately dressed.

ACS reported the parents were meeting the basic needs of the SS as she appeared well cared for with no safety concerns. ACS referred the family to Association to Benefit Children agency for PPRS services.



On 8/12/18, ACS unsubstantiated all allegations against both parents. ACS cited no credible evidence was found to indicate that either parent caused the SC's death through actions or inactions in seeking medical care and attention for the SC.

LDSS Response

On 5/11/18, ACS responded to the report registered by the SCR regarding the death of the two-year-old female by contacting LH to obtain information. ACS also obtained information from LE, ME, EMS and the Specialist interviewed the parents. ACS assessed the SS at the MGM's home and deemed her safe, and she was later returned home with her parents. The allegations of the report were DOA/Fatality and IG of the SC by the parents.

The attending physician in the ER at Lincoln Hospital reported efforts to resuscitate the SC were unsuccessful. ACS documented the physician stated there were no indications of neglect observed on the SC.

The BM informed the Specialist that the SC was born at twenty-six weeks of gestation and remained hospitalized for eight months; she was again hospitalized for one year. The SC was diagnosed with bronchopulmonary dysplasia and heart disease and there were concerns regarding the longevity of the child's life. On 5/10/18, the SC underwent surgery at



Columbia Presbyterian Hospital. Following the surgery, a visiting nurse traveled home with the SC and stayed until approximately 7:30 PM. The SC's pulse was reported to be good when the nurse left. According to the SM, the SC slept a while then played with her sister and appeared normal. The SM also stated the SC was given medication just before bedtime at 12:00AM an hour later at approximately 1:00AM, the SC held her chest as if in pain and her lips appeared blue in color. When the SM checked, the SC's oxygen level had dropped drastically. The SM summoned 911 and attempted CPR until EMS arrived. The SC was pronounced dead at 2:41AM.

The SF was interviewed by ACS on 5/11/18 and he reported that before 12:00AM, he placed the SC in her crib to sleep and attempted to administer oxygen; however, the SC pulled the mask off and after she fell asleep, he administered it. The SF stated he left the home at 1:15AM for his job; he received a call from the SM asking him to return home because the SC was having difficulty breathing. EMS was summoned at 1:30 AM. LE found no criminality and closed their case. The ME reported the final autopsy was pending.

The SC's cardiologist reported the SC was diagnosed with bronchopulmonary dysplasia and she had cardiac disease due to pulmonary hypertension. The SM was compliant with visits and instructions. The surgeon who performed the procedure reported that the parents did nothing that contributed to the SC's death and they had no concerns regarding the care of the children. Both stated she was a "very sick" child.

On 5/16/18, the Specialist received information from the medical provider and neighbor who stated the family always appeared happy and the children were always clean and well cared for with no indications of neglect.

On 5/17/18, the Specialist interviewed the nurse who went home with the family after the surgery and she explained that she had instructed both parents to look for signs that would indicate when emergency medical assistance may be required. She admitted she was worried when she left the home although the SC was stable, because the SC's oxygen levels had been fluctuating. She stated both parents were attentive and loving to the children.

Between 5/18/18 and 8/11/18, ACS continued to visit the home and make collateral contacts and assess the SS. The parents initially accepted, then later declined, services. ACS provided the parents with information for community based services.

On 8/12/18, ACS unsubstantiated all allegations against both parents. ACS cited no credible evidence was found to indicate that either parent caused the SC's death through actions or inactions in seeking medical care and attention for the SC.
