This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns:  A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

#### **Presenting Information**

An SCR report alleged on 4/9/19, at approximately 10:30 AM the parents dropped the 3-month-old subject child off at the maternal grandparents' home for the grandmother to babysit the subject child for the day. At 12:00 PM the grandmother laid the subject child down on the grandfather's bed for a nap. At approximately 4:40 PM, the mother called the grandmother telling her to get the baby ready as she would be picking him up. The grandmother went to the room to wake the subject child and found him unresponsive. The grandmother called EMS. EMS arrived at the home and transported the subject child to the hospital where he was pronounced deceased at 5:17 PM.

#### **Executive Summary**

This report concerns the death of a 3-month-old male child. Rockland County Department of Social Services (RCDSS) received an SCR report on 4/9/19 regarding the death of the subject child. On 4/9/19 the subject child was dropped off at the maternal grandparents' home at 10:30 AM by his parents. At 3:15 PM the maternal grandmother laid the subject child down on the bed in the grandparents' bedroom. The subject child was placed on his stomach with his face turned to the side in the center of the bed on top of the comforter. The subject child did not have any blankets or pillows on or near him on the bed. The maternal grandmother looked in on the subject child at approximately 3:45 PM and he appeared to be sleeping. At 4:30 PM the maternal grandmother went to the bedroom to get the subject child and found him unresponsive. The subject child was in the same position the maternal grandmother placed him in the bed. The maternal grandmother called their community's emergency medical services. EMS arrived at the home at the same time the maternal grandfather arrived home from work. The subject child was transported to the hospital and pronounced deceased at 5:17 PM.

RCDSS contacted the medical examiner who completed an external exam of the subject child. A full autopsy was not completed due to the parents' religious observations. The medical examiner's final report with toxicology results were pending at the time of this writing. There were no noted physical signs of trauma to the subject child's body. There were no SS; however, the maternal grandmother was caring for a 17-month-old cousin of the subject child at the time of the incident. RCDSS appropriately assessed the safety of the cousin and interviewed the parents and there were no noted safety concerns for the cousin. RCDSS spoke with the 17-year-old aunt who resided with the maternal grandparents and there were no noted concerns for her safety and she was not home at the time of the fatal incident.

RCDSS completed all safety assessments and required reports accurately and on time. RCDSS obtained medical and law enforcement records, interviewed family members and several collaterals about the care of the subject child. There were no noted concerns about the care of the subject child by the maternal grandmother. RCDSS appropriately unsubstantiated the allegations of DOA/fatality and inadequate guardianship against the maternal grandmother for the subject child. There was no credible evidence that the maternal grandmother caused the death of the subject child. The family was involved in bereavement services through their religious community and had the support of family. The case was unfounded and closed.

#### LDSS Response

On 4/9/19, RCDSS received the fatality report from the SCR and immediately initiated the investigation. RCDSS obtained information from law enforcement, completed a CPS history check, notified the medical examiner's office and the district attorney's office of the death. There were no SS; however, the maternal grandmother was caring for the 17-month-old cousin to the subject child at the time of the fatal incident. RCDSS assessed the cousin's safety by observing the cousin, interviewing the child's parents and observing their home. There were no noted safety concerns. There was a 17-year-old aunt of the subject child who resided in the home and she was interviewed and her safety was assessed.

RCDSS interviewed the maternal grandmother about the events leading up to the death of the subject child. The maternal grandmother told RCDSS that the parents had dropped the subject child off to her home at 10:30 AM. The maternal grandmother said at approximately 3:15 PM she put the subject child down for a nap on the paternal grandfather's bed. The maternal grandmother said she placed the child on his stomach on top of the comforter with his face turned to the side. The maternal grandmother said the subject had no blankets or pillow on or near him. She said she placed him in the center of the bed. The maternal grandmother said she looked in on the child at approximately 3:45 PM and he appeared to be sleeping. The maternal grandmother went to the bedroom at 4:30 PM to wake the subject child and found him unresponsive. The maternal grandmother said the subject child was in the same position she had placed him in on the bed. She said she called for EMS and they responded to the home and the subject child was transported to the hospital. The maternal grandfather said he arrived home from work at the same time EMS arrive.

RCDSS observed the parent's home and the grandparent's home and there were no noted safety concerns. RCDSS discussed safe sleep with the parents and they were aware of safe sleep and provided the subject child with a safe sleep environment in their home. RCDSS discussed safe sleep with the maternal grandparents and they were aware of safe sleep. RCDSS provided the maternal grandparents with brochures and information as the grandparents often cared for their grandchildren in their home. RCDSS appropriately discussed bereavement services with all family members.

RCDSS obtained information from law enforcement, the medical examiner, emergency services, medical records from the hospital, the children's pediatrician, multiple family members and community members. There were no noted concerns for the care of the subject child.
